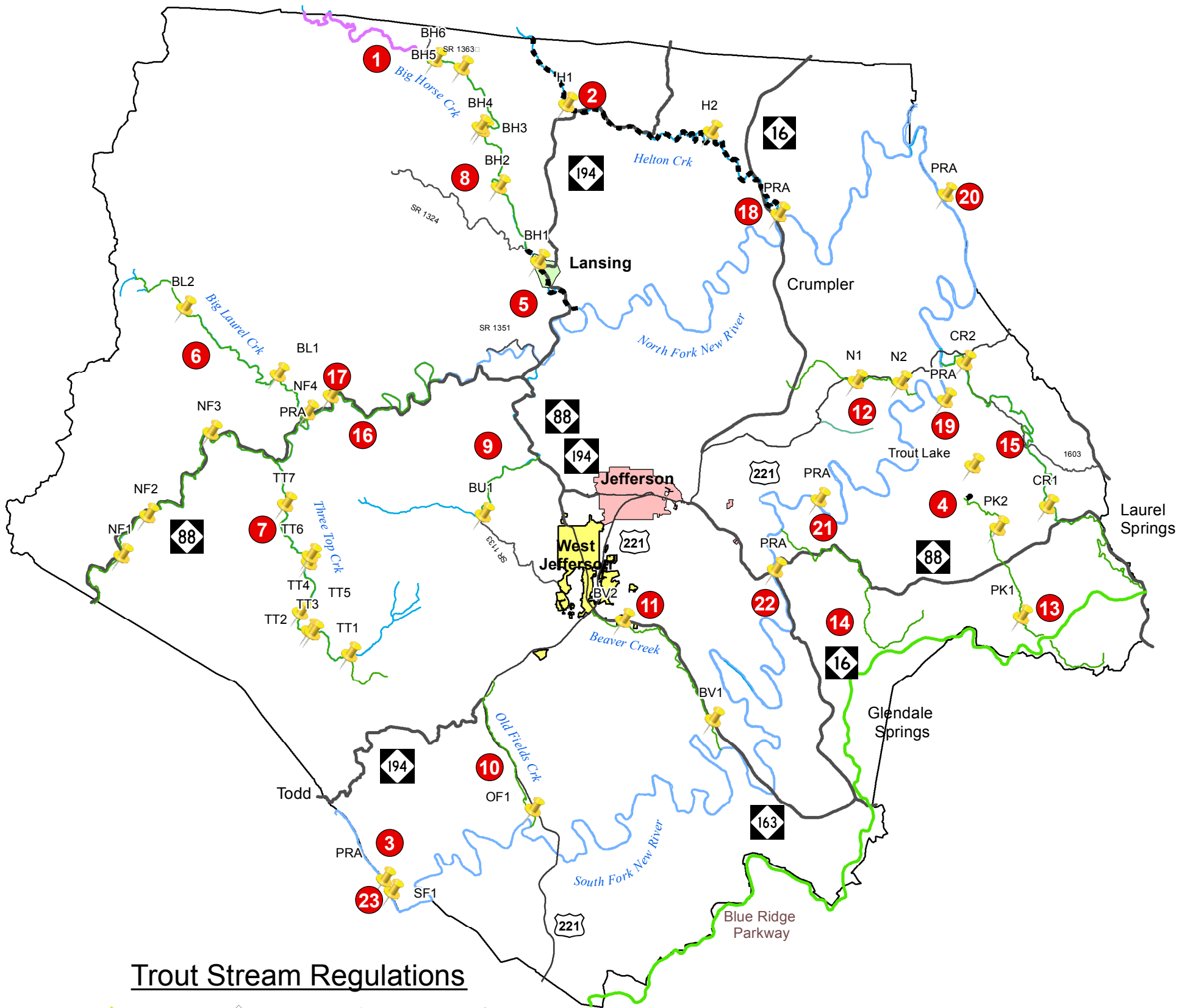
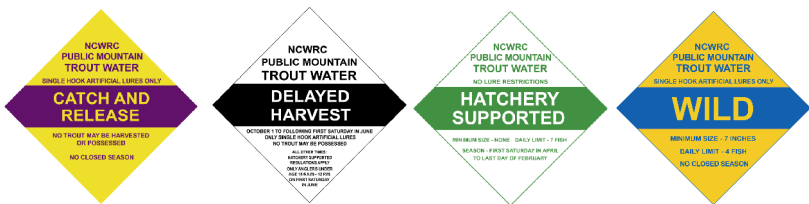


Ashe County Fishing Map

Parking/Access Information

- ❖ Trout Streams - There are no "formal" parking sites. Most Ashe County trout streams are located on private property or in DOT right of ways. Public fishing is allowed through the generosity of landowners. There are many places along the highways to park. Points identified on this map are just a starting point for anglers who are unfamiliar with the streams. Trout fishing regulation signs are posted along streams near stocking locations to help anglers find places to fish. Anglers should avoid property that is posted against trespassing.
- ❖ River Access - Access points shown on this map and other informal access points are found alongside roads and at bridge crossings. Some of these access points may be found on private land and in these cases anglers should get permission from landowners before using them.

Always, honor landowners. To prevent access to fishing areas from being closed to the public, anglers should always show respect for the land they are fishing on. They can do this by removing all their trash, parking only in designated areas, and not blocking access to gates or driveways.
